Option #1 God = Treasure → For All People

**Summary:** "Treasures like God are not to be hoarded." God's good news is for

all peoples, yet too often it has been hoarded and not shared with those who have never had a chance to hear it. In this class, we will look at examples of the early church, and how they DID share this treasure broadly with the peoples of their world. We will look at different ways they did this (not everyone was a Paul or Barnabas!), and prayerfully consider how we might apply these examples to our

lives. If you are one who sees God as your treasure, worthy of

worship by all peoples, then this class is for you.

**Option #2** Letters from Jesus to the Seven Churches

**Summary:** In Revelation chapters 2 and 3, Jesus sent personal letters to the

seven churches of Asia (in modern-day Turkey). These letters are rich with symbolism, vivid imagery, references to first-century culture, and allusions to the Old Testament. In this class, we will dive into the Scriptures to explore the historical context of these early churches, uncover the messages Jesus was conveying, and reflect on what these teachings mean for the church today.
